Program Impact

Initially, the organization will serve thirty athletes, coaches and support staff will be served directly as members of the two teams. When local and provincial feeder teams are established per plan in Afghanistan, in excess of 600 athletes, coaches and support staff will be served directly, with an order of magnitude difficult to estimate benefitting from the direct and residual educational, social and cultural interaction and international exposure.

In addition to the clear direct and ancillary benefits for the people of Afghanistan, communities, athletes and the youth in the United States will be presented a unique opportunity for rich cultural exchange on a very personal basis. Our plans call for the Afghanistan Water Polo athletes to become goodwill ambassadors for their country, culture and sport by volunteering to perform high-visibility community service and activities in all communities within which the team trains and to heavily participate and accept speaking engagements at local schools, community organizations, and business groups which will help raise local awareness of the situation in Afghanistan and build cultural bridges through the athletes' personal experiences.

The Afghanistan National Water Polo Team will train in many different areas of the United States (and internationally) and will compete against various aquatic teams, both in swimming and water polo, at the age group levels (15 and older) and at the collegiate level (off season). This is a great opportunity for the Afghan people and communities in the United States and around the world.

Volunteers

Our plan to achieve Afghanistan's Olympic Dream greatly depends on expanding our list of those volunteering their time and expertise in Coaching and Refereeing, Marketing, Sponsorship, Legal Services, Advertising and Fundraising, Photography, Event Management, Web and Graphic Design, or simply the *"whatever it takes"* attitude that is the hallmark of volunteerism.
